



Making e-mail a little safer

■ Ballymount firm takes on big players with e-mail service

AN Irish owned security firm based in Ballymount has launched a free web-based e-mail service providing what it claims is state-of-the-art security.

Top Security is aiming the product at both home and small business users alike.

T o p m a i l (www.topmail.ie) is fully automated, according to the company, "meaning that even the most inex-

perienced e-mail user can easily activate it and its accompanying security features".

Following 18 months of development and testing Topmail deploys on three levels of antivirus and antispam, as well as strong content filtering, updating

every seven minutes to protect against fast-breaking, evolving threats.

Founder and chairman of Top Security Emmet O'Rafferty said: "Core to the Topmail service is its simplicity and effectiveness.

"It offers a means of communicating securely via e-mail without the worry of spam and viruses or receiving offensive and sometimes disturbing content or material that can often disable, if not destroy, a person's PC or laptop in one simple click."

He added: "Round the clock security support, cutting-edge technology and multimillion euro infrastructures ensure that Topmail is one of the most secure web-based e-mail services in the world today."

Chief Executive of South Dublin Chamber Peter O'Byrne said: "E-mail spam is a significant cost to business, it costs money for staff not being able to use e-mail and management having to buy in higher grade filters.

"Some spam e-mails and viruses can actually prevent e-mails going to cli-

ents which can be quite frustrating so we would definitely welcome this type of service."

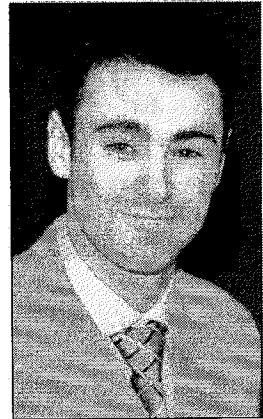
He added: "Chambers Ireland conducted a survey which showed that 4.5 per cent of turnover is spent on ICT solutions, and that's not on new computers but on solutions to problems, that's an incredible amount of money to be lost."
